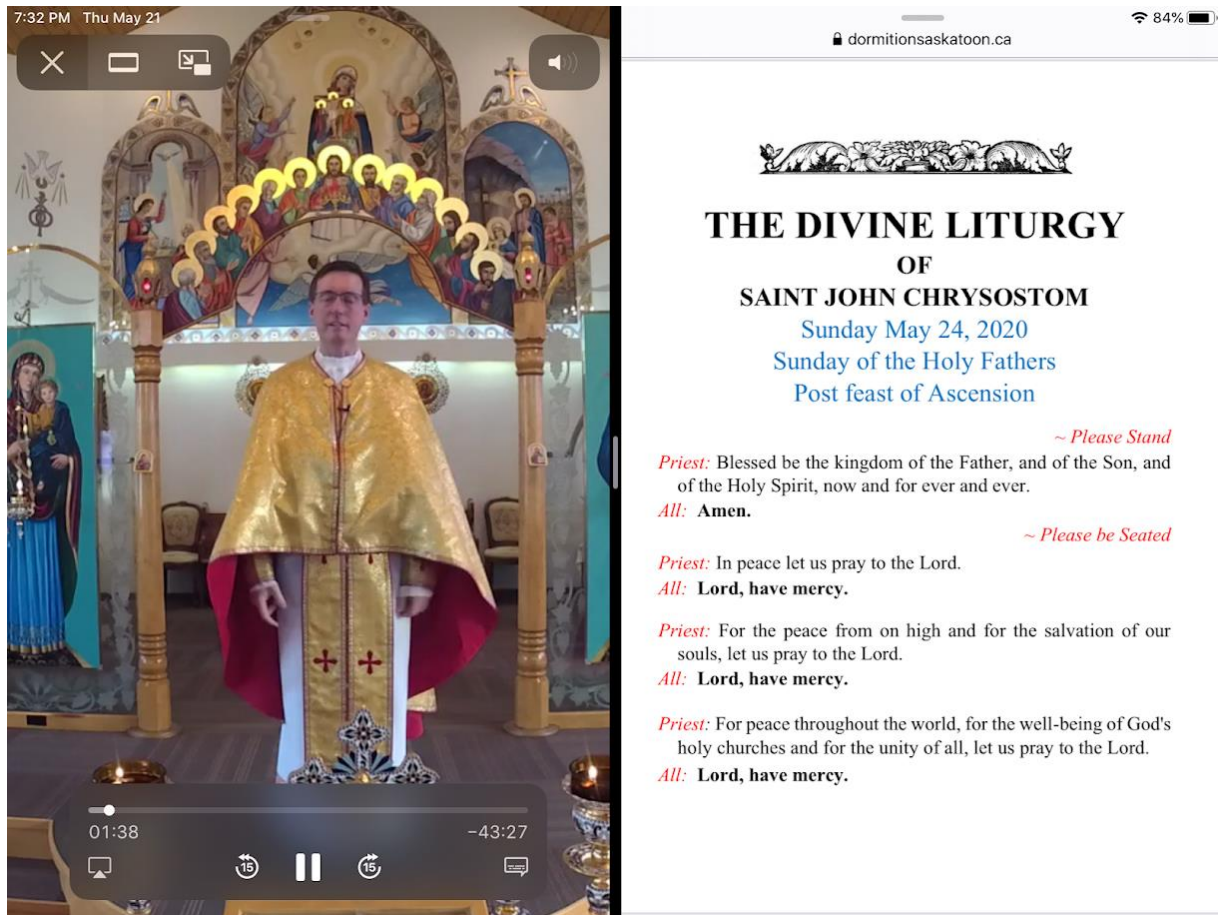


Glory to Jesus Christ!

Goal: To display Fr. André's Liturgy on one half of your iPad screen and the Liturgy Text on the other half of the screen.



Solution: If you have a first generation iPad (an iPad with that wider connector), sorry but you are unable to continue.



First Generation iPad Connector

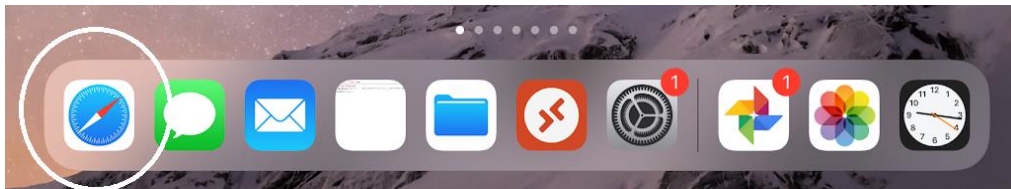


Next Generation iPad Connector

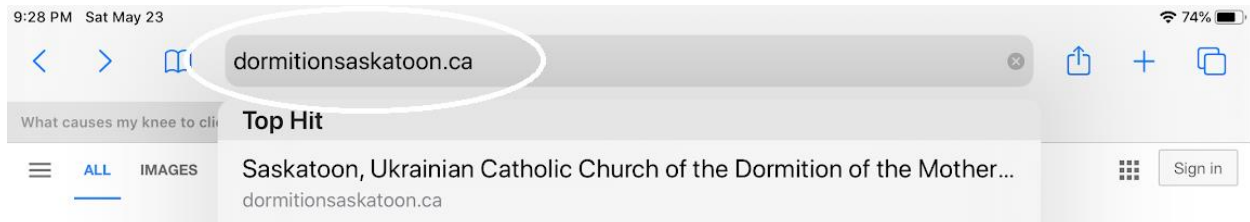
If you have a next generation iPad, you will have to check to see if you have iOS 11.0 or higher on your iPad. Go to Setting

icon , select General, select About, Software Version.

Let's start by making a shortcut to our LiturgyLive website. Find the Safari Icon on your desktop. It is the icon that looks like a compass.



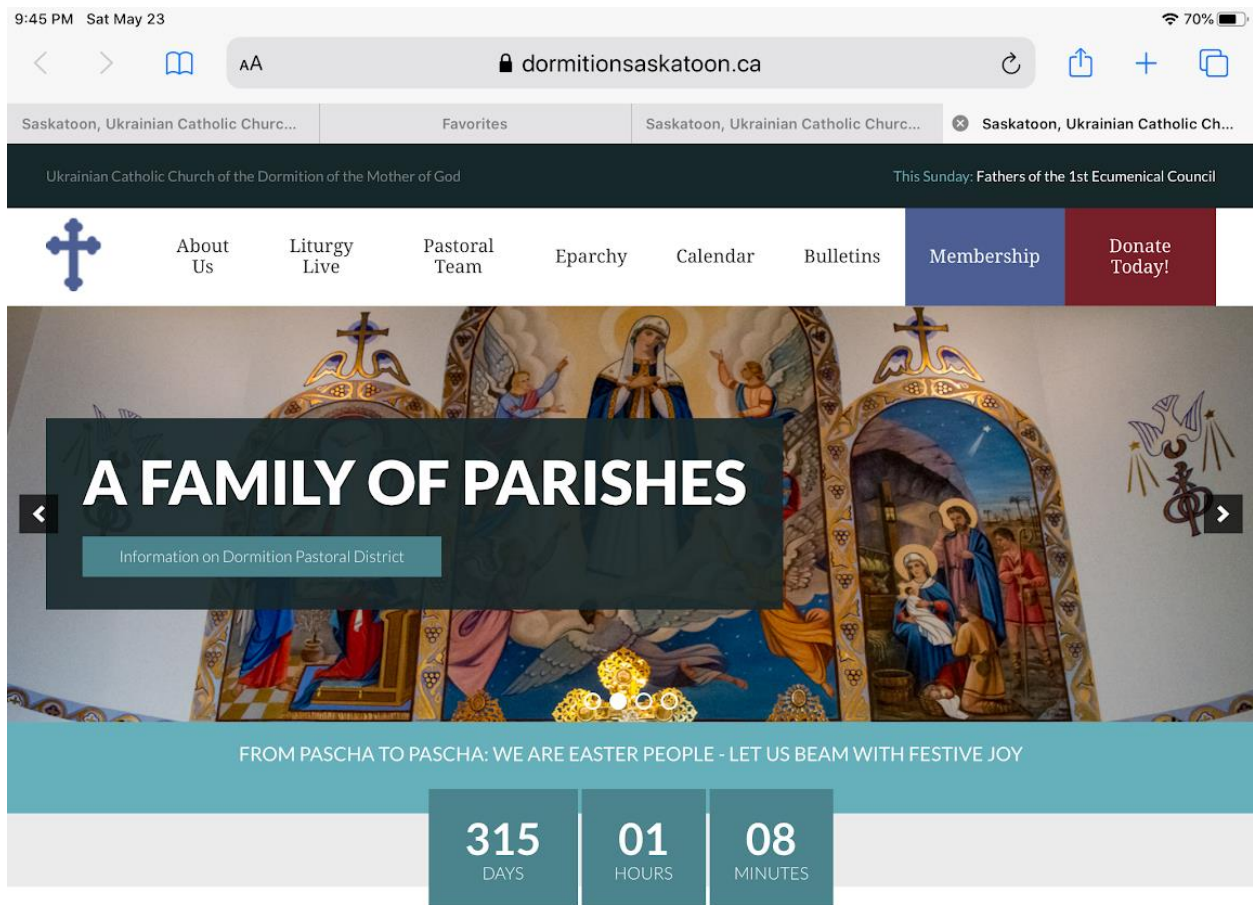
The easiest way to get to our website is by typing the address directly into the address bar. Our address is: dormitionsaskatoon.ca



After typing dormitionsaskatoon.ca, press the “go” button on the keyboard




This will then take you to the Dormition Home page.

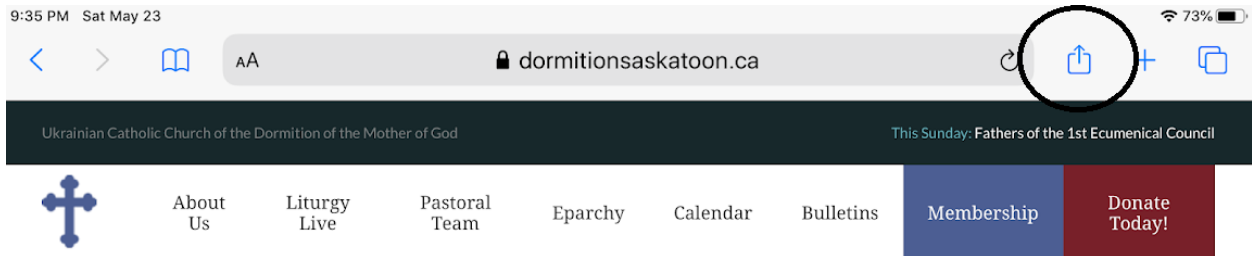


You will then select the Liturgy Live tab and then select the Liturgy Live Option.

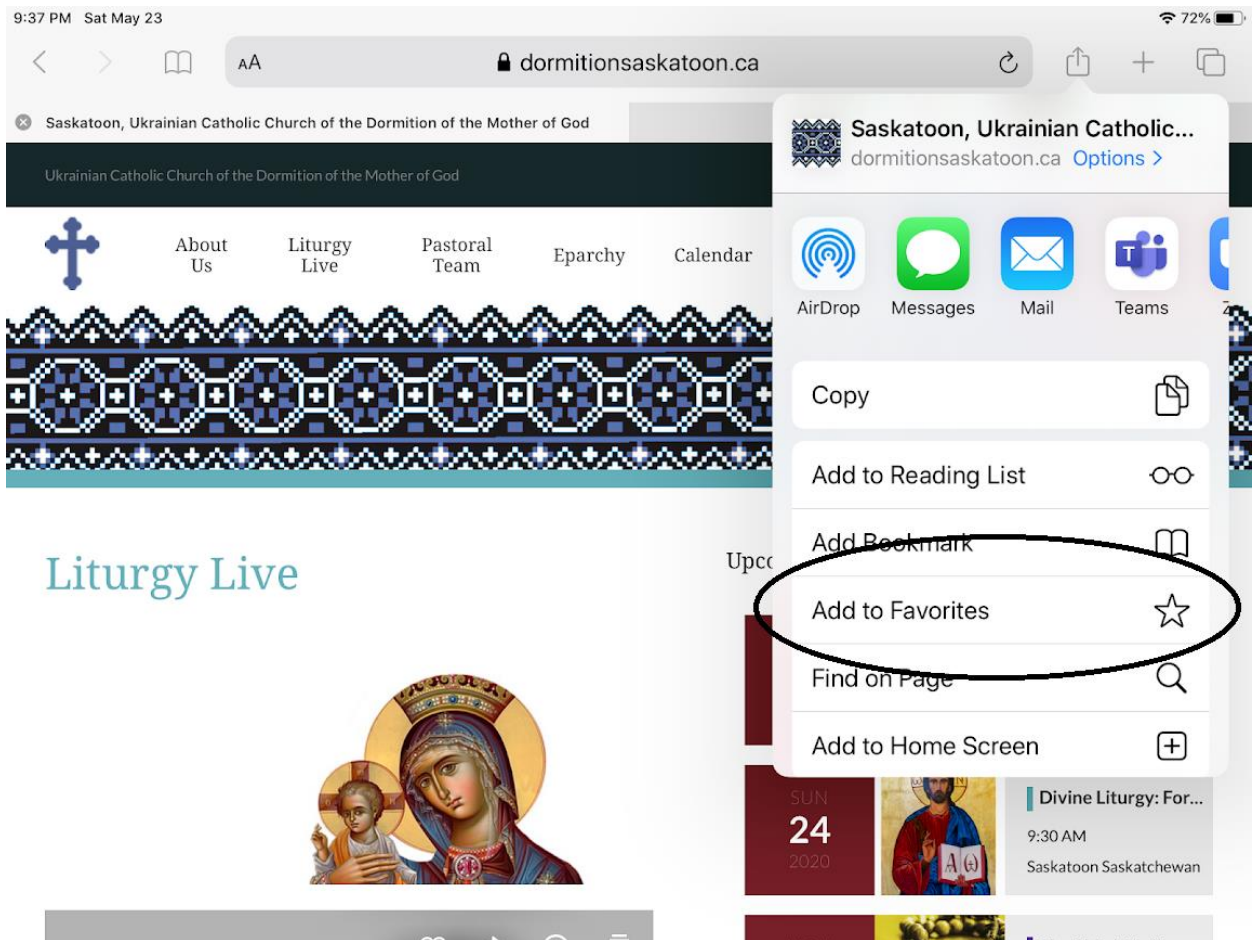


This will take you to the Liturgy Live Page. Good job....we are half way there. 😊

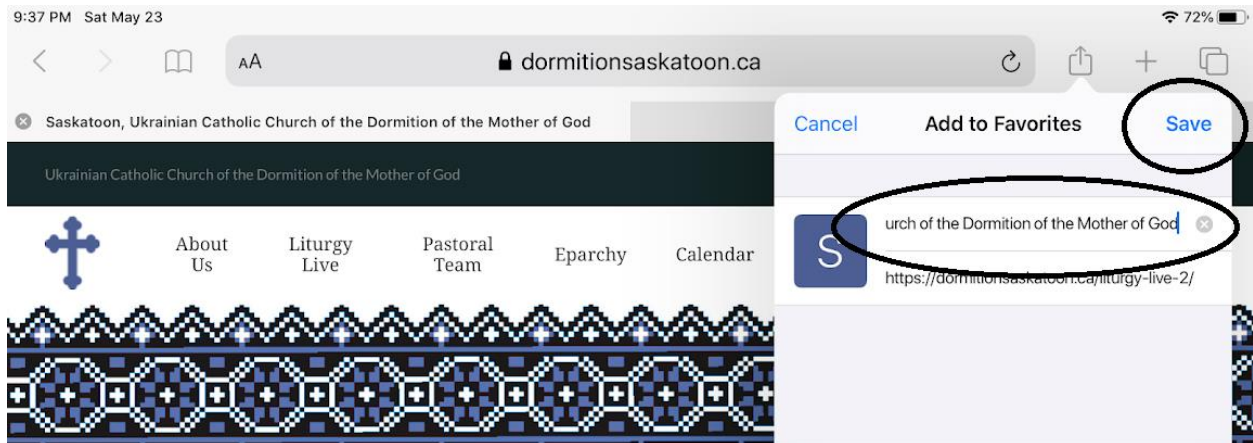
Now we want to add this page to our favorites. You do this by selecting the  icon found in the Upper Right of your iPad screen.




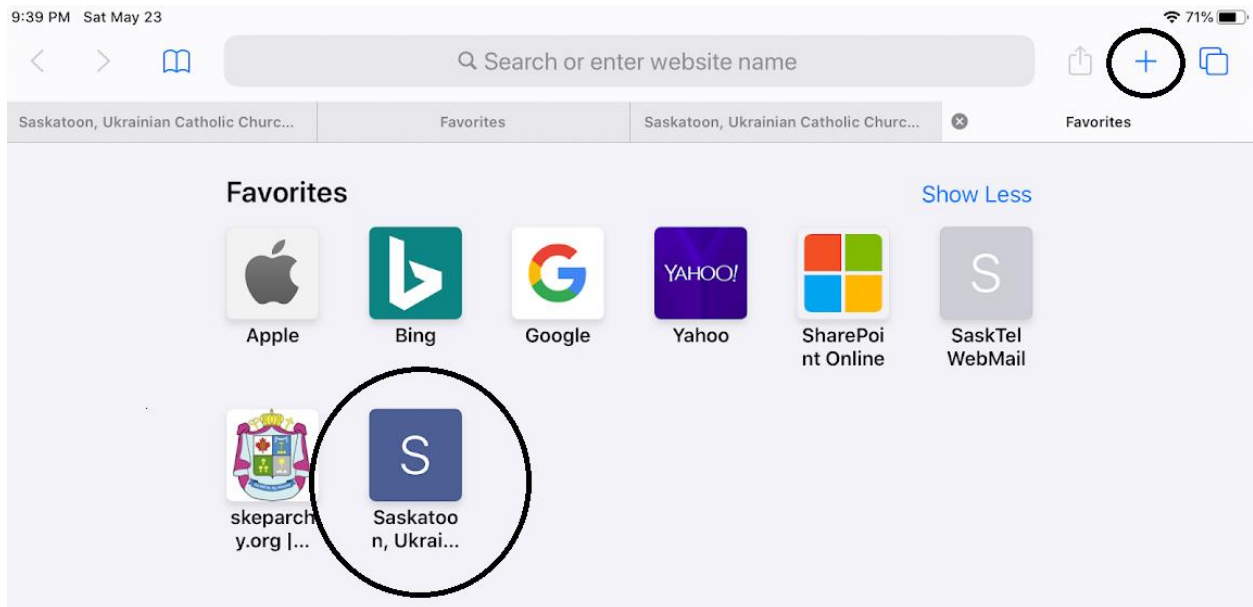
Then select the Add to Favorites Option. This option may not be visible so you may have to scroll down the list.



After selecting Add to Favorites, you will be prompted to Save the Shortcut. You can rename it or just select the Save option.




Now, if you Press the  icon found in the Upper Right-hand corner of your iPad screen, you will see the shortcut in your favorites list. By selecting this icon, you will be taken directly to the LiturgyLive page.

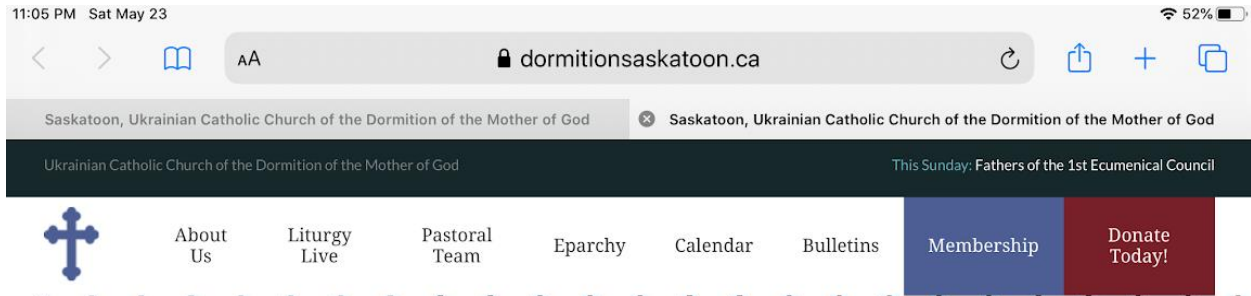


Now the easy part!

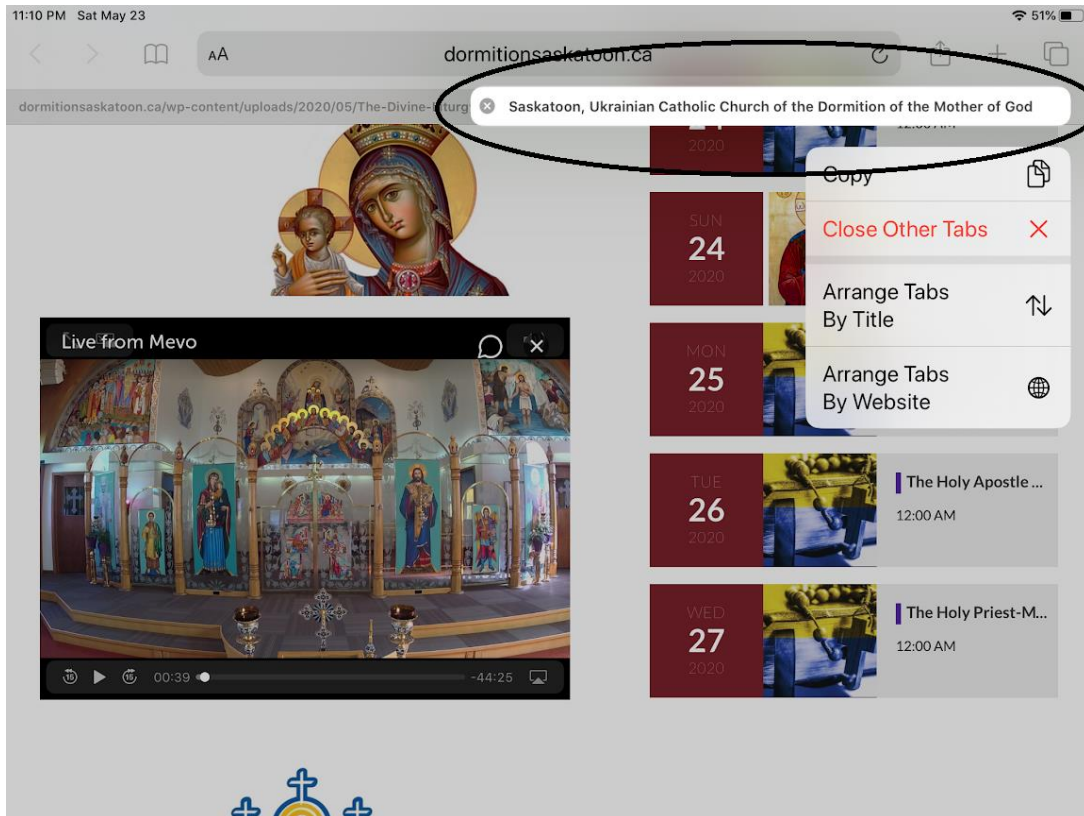
Select the LiturgyLive favorite shortcut



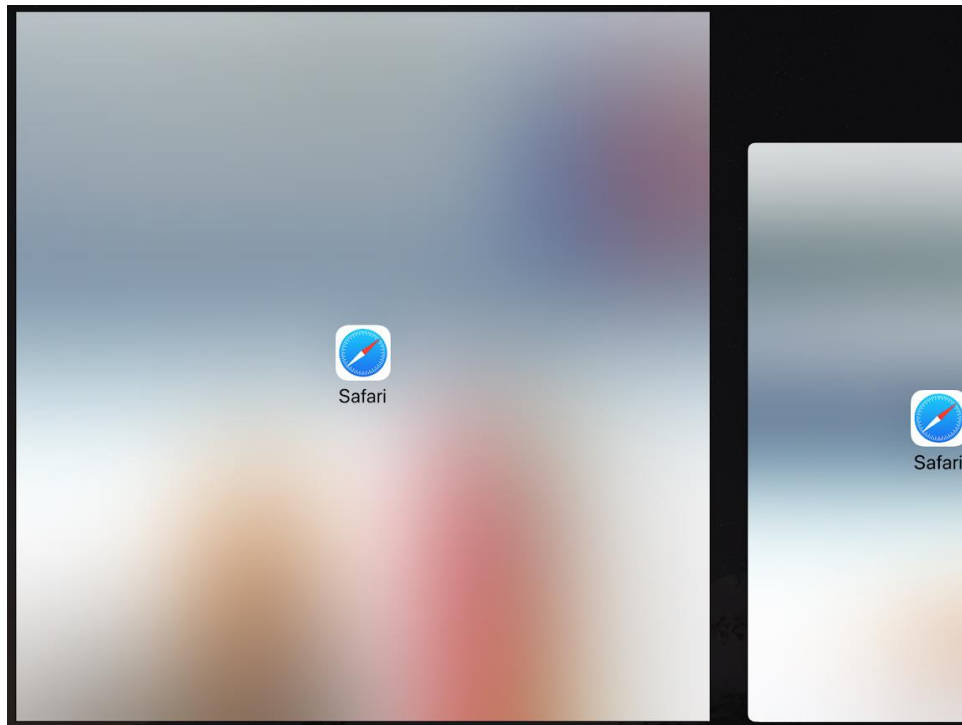
Now you want to create another page with the text, so you select the  icon again and select the LiturgyLive favorite shortcut again. The top of your iPad screen should look something like this with two tabs showing Saskatoon, Ukrainian Catholic....



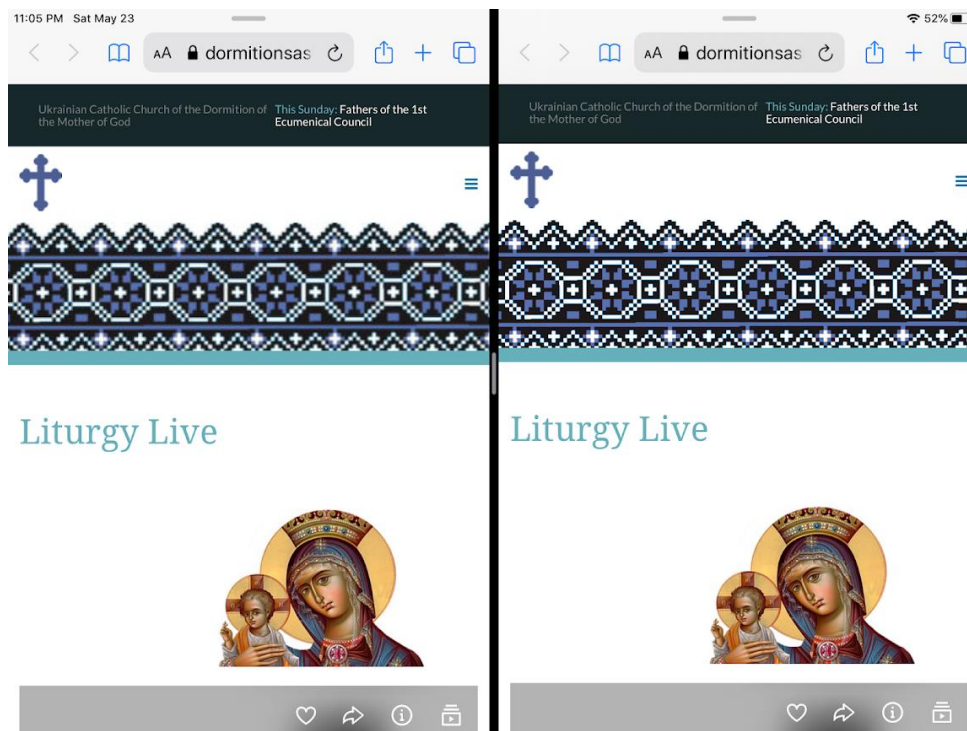
Now “Press and Keep Pressing” the Right tab and you should see something like this....but keep pressing.



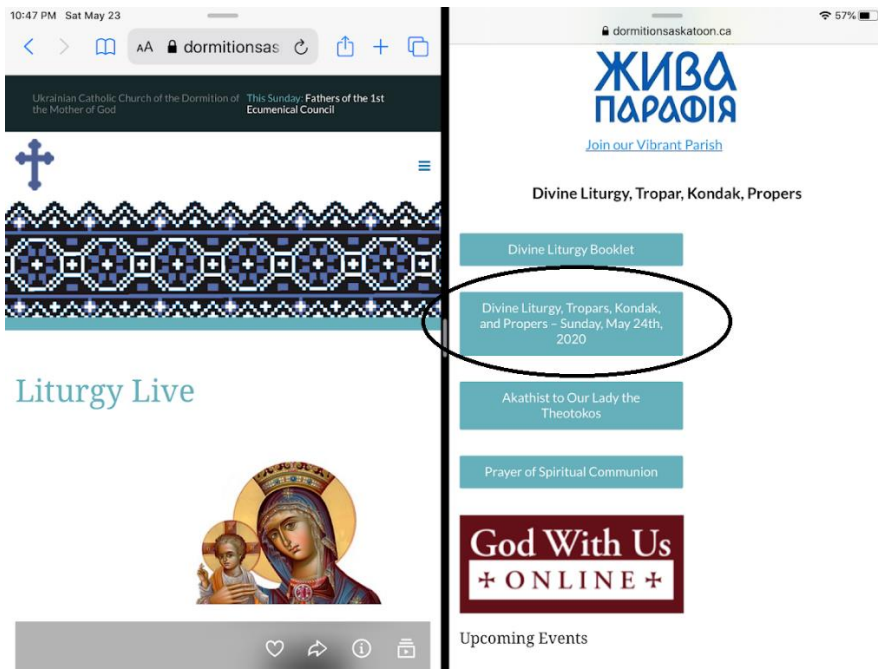
While still pressing, slide your finger to the Right side of the iPad screen and you should start to see it change like this.



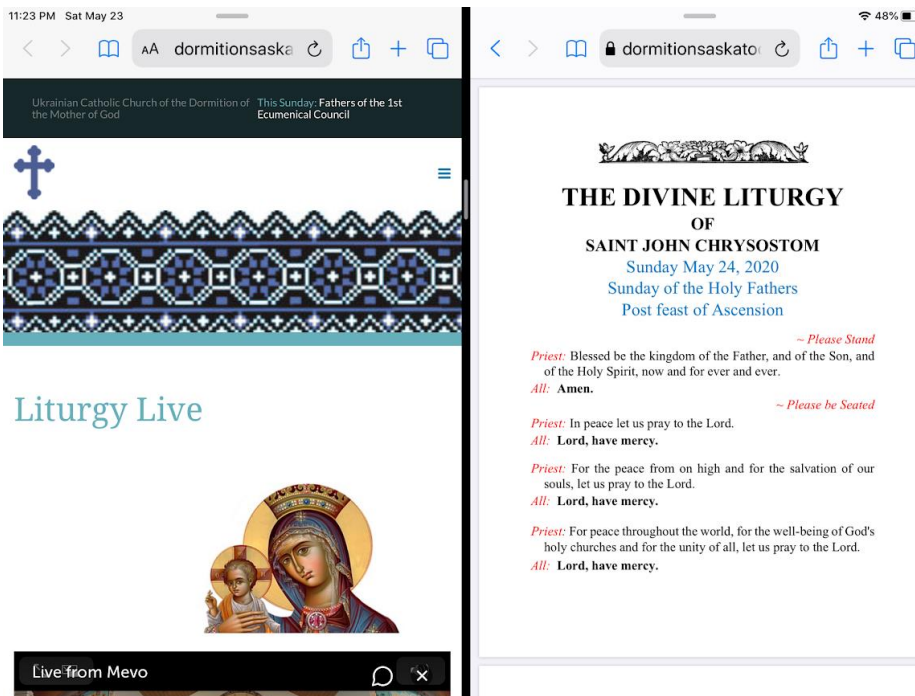
Now lift your finger and your screen will now look like this.



You can now select the Right side and scroll down and find the Divine Liturgy Text.



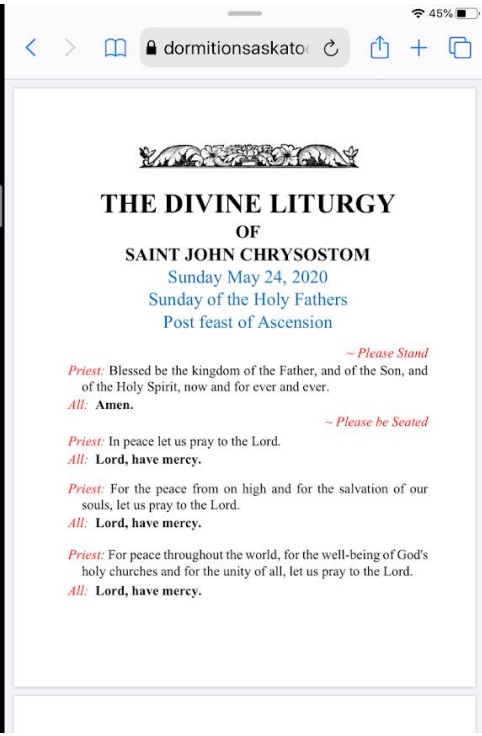
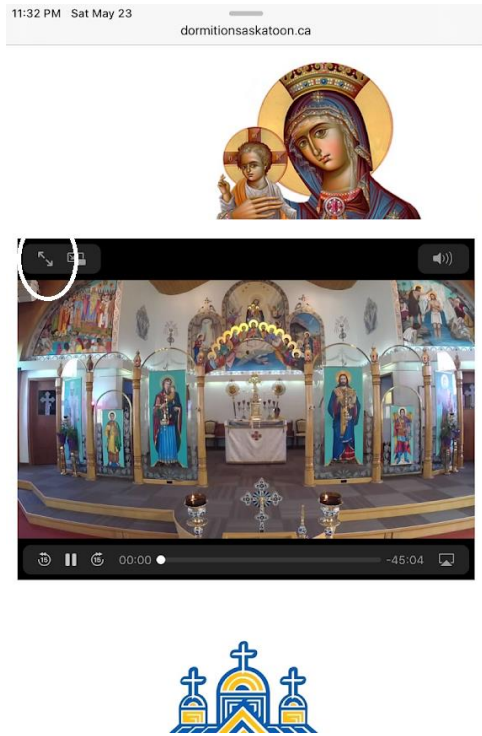
After you select it your iPad will have the text displayed on the Right half. You can then



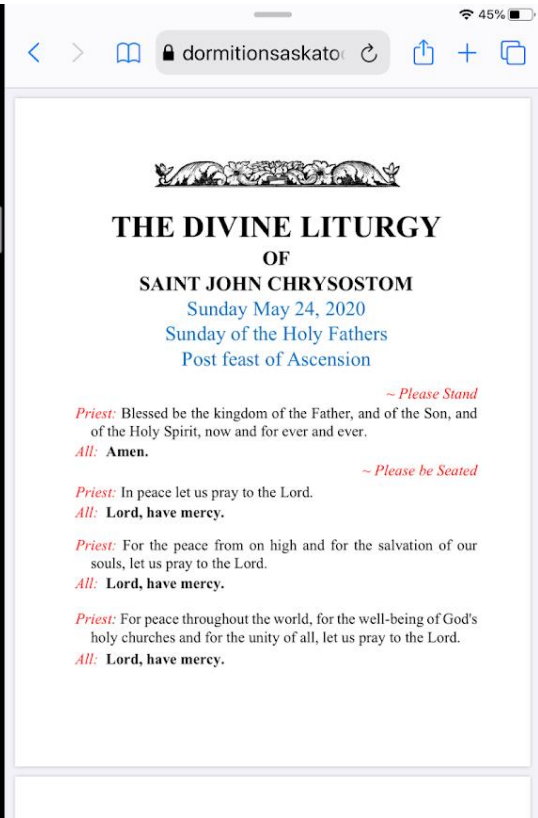
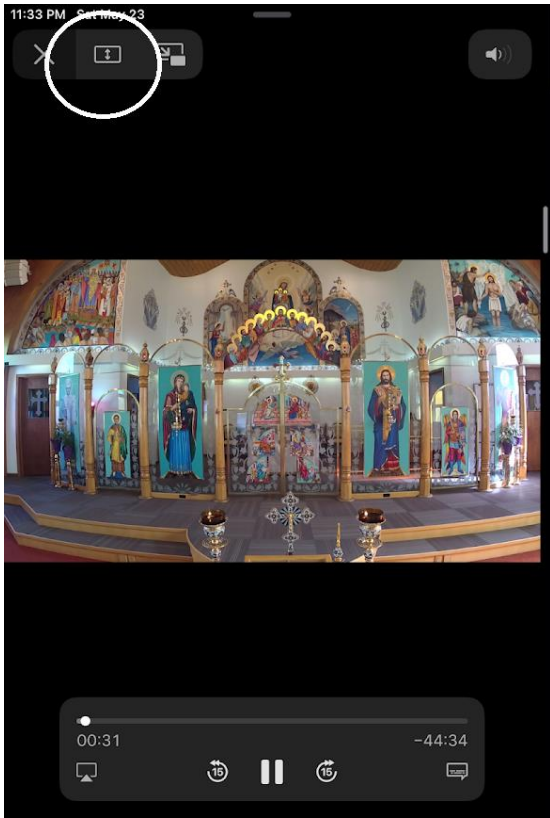
On the left half you can now scroll down and start the video.

You can start the video by pressing the play button found in the middle of the video. Once the video is playing, you can increase the size of the video by pressing the icon in the upper left hand corner of the video. Sometimes the word “Live from Mevo” is there but if you wait a second or two it will disappear. You may also need to tap that screen to display the icons.



Now, if you want it to fit the entire left side of your iPad, tap the video again and select the expand horizontal icon



You will then have the Liturgy playing on the entire iPad screen.

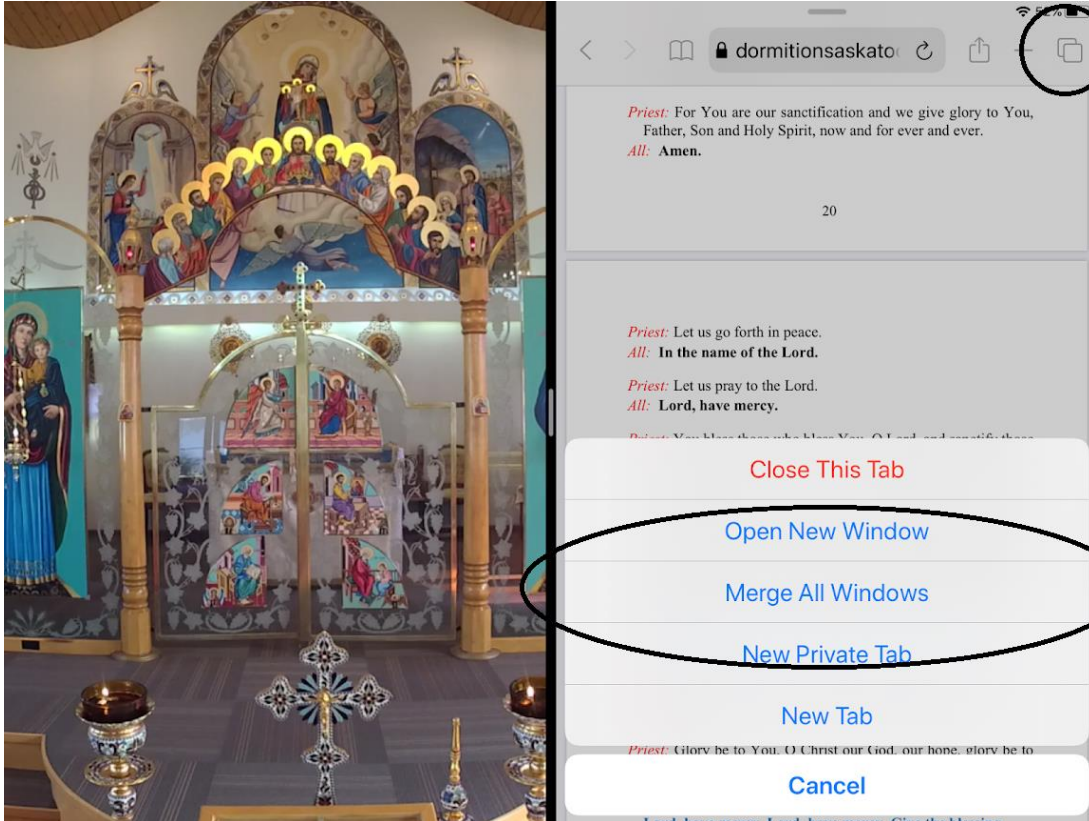
~ Please Stand

Now after the Liturgy, you can stop the split screen by Pressing and Holding the  icon until the menu is displayed. The  icon is found in the upper Right hand corner of the iPad screen. You would then select “Merge all Windows” and you are back to normal.
