GLORY TO JESUS CHRIST!

In the Gospel today, Jesus concludes the parable with a quotation from the Psalms about a stone, rejected by builders, that became the chief cornerstone, the most crucial part of the foundation of a building. He shifts the imagery here from a vineyard, the people of Israel, to a temple that includes all who are members of the Body of Christ. With this good news comes great responsibility, for we have to ask ourselves whether we are being good stewards of the vineyard of the Lord. Are we offering our fruit, which is really His fruit, to Him? We are not talking simply about grapes, but about our lives in this world, especially what we value and treasure the most, our most cherished abilities and strengths, and the habits and routines most familiar to us. To change the metaphor, are we going through each day as living stones of His temple? Are we grounding ourselves thoroughly on our one true foundation Jesus Christ and turning away from all that is not holy? Our calling is not to escape the world, but to offer our little pieces of it for the healing and fulfillment of the Kingdom. It is through making our life in this world holy that we participate already in the world to come.

Reconciliation and healing – financial appeal announced by Saskatchewan bishops: In a joint letter released July 3, the five Catholic bishops of Saskatchewan wrote to faithful across the province about plans for a new fundraising appeal for residential school survivors, families and communities, saying: “We have heard the strong request, from Indigenous and non-Indigenous people in various quarters to initiate a new fundraising campaign to support survivors and engage more deeply in our own ongoing commitment and response to the Truth and Reconciliation process. Many members of our Catholic community have expressed their solidarity and support for the ongoing work of healing for survivors and their families, which could take the shape of supporting local projects of the National Indian Brotherhood and responding locally to TRC Calls to Action involving a financial commitment, as guided by Indigenous communities here in Saskatchewan.”

Dormition Parish – Quarter 2 Financial Report

Despite Covid and all its restrictions, the Parish results remain positive. Total Income YTD at \$74,955.77 is pacing just slightly short of budget at the halfway point. Sunday in-person offerings are way down, but Pre-Authorized Debits as well as Online Donations bring the Sunday offerings over budget YTD. While Capital Fund, Parish Functions and Church Donations all track considerably off budget for obvious reasons.

On the Expense side, we are tracking to come in well below budget for the year. Currently at \$66,254.05 vs a budget of \$153,000.00. These savings are driven mostly in part by the costs related to operating the church and running programs which have been put on hold. Extraordinary expenditures this quarter included replacement of rectory windows and window coverings; the latter being sponsored by our Ukrainian Catholic Women's League.

Leaves a YTD profit of \$8,701.72 vs a full year budget break even at +\$1.050.00
