GLORY TO JESUS CHRIST!

Reconciliation is at the heart of the Christian message. It is at the heart of what we do when we are faithful to our calling as disciples and as a community of faith. It is why the Church must respond to the Truth & Reconciliation Calls to Action. As we prepare to celebrate the first National Day for Truth and Reconciliation this Thursday, September 30, which honours the lost children and Survivors of residential schools, their families, and communities, I encourage you to educate yourself about the history and legacy of residential schools, and why apologies to former residential school students, their families, and communities were necessary (TRC Call to Action #59). On the National Centre for Truth and Reconciliation website, we can learn about this history and read the 2015 Calls to Action. To learn about the spirit of the land and its history, the trauma of Residential Schools, and moving forward in harmony, plan to visit Wanuskewin ("peaceful gathering place" in nēhiyawēwin) and participate in their National Day for Truth and Reconciliation events this Thursday. And take some time to read the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops Statement of Apology to the Indigenous Peoples of This Land, which was issued this past Friday.

An Eastern Christian Point of View on the Season of Creation

"Where there is no vision, the people will perish" Proverbs 29:18

The ecological vision of the Eastern Church is grounded in the Biblical and Patristic understanding of the interrelation and reciprocity outlined in the five main points below:

- 1) Creation is an ecological order involving unity, diversity, interdependence, hierarchy, and harmony.
- 2) Human nature is both integrally part of the order of creation, and at the same time, there is something in our nature our Divine image that transcends the created order, making us both responsible for creation as priests and stewards and dependent upon it in our kinship with all life.
- 3) The nature of the relationship of human nature with the order of nature is one of dynamic reciprocity; that is, what humans are and what humans do is central to sustaining or the destruction of order and harmony in nature.
- 4) Metanoia change of heart followed by a change of life is key to all earth keeping and care for creation. If human nature is integral to the order of nature, then disorder in nature can be restored only by order in human beings.
- 5) The human energy that creates, sustains, and restores order in nature is the energy of sacrificial love, grounded in *ascesis* self-discipline.
