(Tone 4): Your nativity, O Virgin Mother of God,* has made joy known to all the world,* for from you dawned the Sun of Righteousness, Christ our God.* He abolished the curse* and gave the blessing;* and by making death of no effect He bestowed on us eternal life.

Blessing of Bread, Wheat, Wine, and Oil

Priest: Let us pray to the Lord.

All: Lord have mercy.

Priest: O Lord Jesus Christ our God, You blessed the five loaves and fed the five thousand. Bless + these loaves, this wheat, wine, and oil, and multiply them in this city and throughout the world; and sanctify all the faithful who shall partake of them; for it is You, O Christ our God, Who bless and sanctify all things, and we glorify You with Your eternal Father and Your all-holy, gracious, and lifegiving Spirit, now and forever and ever.

All: Amen. Blessed be the name of the Lord now and forever. (three times)

Psalm 33 (Sung to the melody of the Akathist)

I will bless the Lord at all times;* His praise shall be constantly in my mouth.* My soul shall glory in the Lord;* let the meek hear and rejoice.* Magnify the Lord with me,* and let us exalt His name together.* I sought the Lord and He heard me,* and delivered me from all my fears.* Approach the Lord and be enlightened,* and your face shall never be shamed.* This poor man cried out and the Lord heard him* and delivered him from all his afflictions.* The angel of the Lord will set up camp* around those who fear the Lord and save them.* Taste and see how good the Lord is;* blessed is the one who hopes in Him.* Fear the Lord, all you His saints,* for there

is no privation for those who fear Him.* The rich have become poor and hungry* but those who seek the Lord shall not want any good.

All: Amen.

All: Amen. O God, strengthen the orthodox faith for ever and ever!

Priest: O most holy Mother of God, save us.

All: More honourable than the cherubim * and by far more glorious than the seraphim; * ever a virgin, you gave birth to God the Word, * O true Mother of God, we magnify you.

Priest: Glory be to You, O Christ our God, our hope, glory be to You.

All: Glory be to the + Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit,
* now and for ever and ever. Amen. * Lord, have mercy, Lord,
have mercy, Lord, have mercy. * Give the blessing.

Priest: Christ our true God, who in fiery tongues, sent down from heaven the Most Holy Spirit upon His holy disciples and apostles

for our salvation, through the prayers of His immaculate Mother, patroness of this church; of the holy, glorious, and all-praiseworthy apostles; and of all the saints, will have mercy and save us, for He is good and loves mankind.

All: Amen.

After the dismissal, we may sing the Kontakion of the feast:

(Tone 4): By your birth, O immaculate one,* Joachim and Anna were freed from the reproach of childlessness,* and Adam and Eve* from the corruption of death.* And your people, redeemed from the guilt of their sins,* celebrate as they cry out to you:* "The barren one gives birth to the Mother of God* and nourisher of our life."
