#### **GLORY TO JESUS CHRIST!**

In the last line of the Gospel today, Jesus says "everyone who belongs to the truth listens to my voice." What does it mean to belong to the truth? Belonging is a word with a pretty specific meaning. Today, we might belong to a variety of different things. Perhaps we are members of this parish; we can belong to political parties; we can belong to the Knights or the UCWL or to a sports team. We can belong to a gym. In all of these cases, to belong means to make a commitment to something, to accept some responsibility for something in order to be a part of it. Membership comes with benefits and privileges, but membership also implies that we have a vested interest in what we belong to, that we will work to carry out the mission of the organization, and that we will represent the organization faithfully. Today, Jesus invites us to belong to the truth of the kingdom of God. That comes with great privilege. And it comes with great responsibility. We're called to be living witnesses of the kingdom of God, to faithfully represent God's kingdom to the world.
