To all clergy and staff of the Ukrainian Catholic Eparchy of Saskatoon,

- 1. Effective Monday, March 16, 2022, the Government of the Province of Saskatchewan announced the end of public masking requirements in most non-medical settings. We anticipate that local municipalities will follow the lead of the province in removing bylaws requiring masks, but you must verify with the local health authority. Accordingly, our churches, halls and offices will also no longer require masking, unless stipulated otherwise by municipal authorities.
- 2. Revoking the letter of March 13, 2020, on-line participation in Divine Liturgy is no longer considered a fulfillment of one's obligation for Sundays and Feasts, except for those in poor health, who would be unable to attend church in normal circumstances.
- 3. The use of **individual chalices (for clergy) and individual spoons** for distribution of Holy Communion is to continue until further notice.
- 4. Only **non-contact veneration** of icons and crosses (e.g., for the Sunday of the Cross) is permitted (i.e., no kissing of sacred objects) and it is to continue until further notice.
- 5. The use of **hand sanitizer** upon entry to the church and/or parish hall remains a best-practice and is encouraged. Therefore, it is recommended that sanitizing stations remain in place and signage regarding use of hand sanitizer continue to be posted in parishes at this time.
- 6. Parishioners should be encouraged to continue **self-screening for Covid-19** symptoms and stay home if they have any symptoms.

2022 ANNUAL EPARCHIAL APPEAL

This weekend marks the kick-off to our 2022 and **7th Annual Eparchial Appeal**. The Appeal will run April 23/24 to June 4/5, 2022. The theme of the 2022 Annual Eparchial Appeal is "For much will be required of those to whom much is given" (Luke 12:48). The theme doesn't only refer to the personal blessings that have been bestowed on us by God, but also, we must consider the sacrifice that Jesus Christ made for our salvation. Therefore, because of His sacrifice and His great love for us, we are asked to, in return, love greatly and use everything He has bestowed on us for His glory.

Thanks to your generosity, prayers and your kind support over the past six years, the Eparchial Appeal has been successful in raising just over \$942,983 for Eparchial Ministries, Bishop Roborecki Foundation and Parishes through the Parish Rebate Program. Your support of the Appeal continues to nurture, grow, preserve, and strengthen our Ukrainian Catholic Faith and to make our parishes vibrant. A heartfelt and sincere THANK YOU for your support.

The 2022 Annual Eparchial Goal is set at \$250,000. This may seem like a big number, however, when broken down to an amount per each Parish Family in the Eparchy, it amounts to approximately \$110 per each Parish Family. However, we know that only approximately 26% of the Faithful in the Eparchy support the Appeal. Therefore, we are asking those Parish Families who can do so to please make a \$110 donation on behalf of your family, and another \$110 on behalf of another family who may not be in a financial position to make a \$110 donation to the Appeal.

The future sustainability of these Eparchial Ministries is dependent on a fundraising effort through the Annual Eparchial Appeal. Most of the programs offered through the Eparchial Ministries cannot be offered by individual Parishes because of limited resources, both financial and human. That is why it is so critical that the Faithful of our Eparchy continue to collectively ensure that the Eparchy can provide these Eparchial Ministry programs by supporting the Annual Eparchial Appeal.

Over the next few weeks, you will have the opportunity to learn more about our Eparchial Ministries and how they contribute to create Vibrant Parishes as a place to encounter the Living Christ.
