The Facebook pages below has families that are seeking hosts who can give them temporary shelter and support as they seek employment and housing. Should you wish to support Displaced Ukrainians, check their page, and post that you are interested. There is screening process and criminal record checks are required to ensure matches are safe. Feel free to visit and read posts on the site to gather further information. If you are an employer, you can also post the job you have and let people know you are seeking employees. We continue to add to our list of items to donate to Displaced Ukrainians persons. Currently what seems to be most needed is furniture and beds. 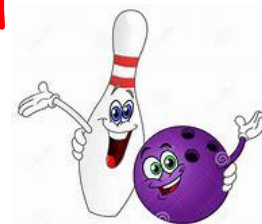

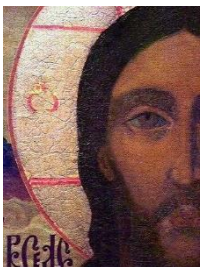
2022 ANNUAL EPARCHIAL APPEAL
