Brothers and sisters,

GOD SENT HIS SON INTO THE WORLD NOT TO CONDEMN THE WORLD, BUT THAT THE WORLD, THROUGH HIM, MIGHT BE SAVED. I'm often shocked and surprised by how many think that God would condemn us. Why? Our good news is that God does for us that which we cannot do for ourselves: Not to condemn. Although our pride deserves condemnation, we receive not condemnation, but salvation. Our great sense of direction in life is but our stumbling in the dark, much as Nicodemus may have been trying to find the light through Christ. Into our darkness, Christ brings us light, shows us the way to eternal life.

Update on our support of Refugees and Displaced Ukrainian Persons

Glory to God giver of all that is good! Thank you for your generosity. From the generous offerings of finances, furniture, clothing, and miscellaneous items we have been able to help several families.

- To date we have helped two sets of Afghanistan refugees with items such as food, clothing, TV, furniture, and miscellaneous items (soccer shoes, student desk, bicycles, toys and sport balls). We provided support so part-time employment was found for the teens in one family. We have provided transportation for purchase of items, sporting events and medical treatment.
- We have helped four sets of Displaced Ukrainian families/persons with help with transportation, furniture, food and some miscellaneous items. ***There is a current need for childcare as the women have found jobs. We are hoping to build "Welcome Baskets" in the next two weeks to give to families as there will be many more families arriving.

Seeking ways to help those who are fleeing to Canada from war-torn Ukraine? The Ukrainian Canadian Congress of Saskatchewan was established in 1972 and is the provincial council of the national UCC. The UCC represents and serves nearly 150 cultural and other Ukrainians grassroots organizations throughout the province. UCC Saskatchewan has also been engaged with the settlement of Ukrainians and other newcomers for well over 15 years. UCC Saskatchewan currently has five staff members in both Regina and Saskatoon who are working to settle arriving displaced Ukrainians together with Saskatchewan's many settlement agencies. Fill a Container for Ukraine

This is a project set up by Stream of Hopes. They have acquired a 40-foot container can which fits up to 20,000 kg of aid. This container will be at the warehouse on 3403 Faithful Avenue. It will be available from June 17 to July 16. It will be open Friday from 5-9pm and Saturday and Sunday from 11-5pm. The container will be shipped to Chernivtsi to Marta Levchenko a trusted contact. The items they are looking to collect include:

Work gloves, non perishable foods, cooking oil, diapers and baby food, feminine and personal hygiene products, medical supplies for kids and grown-ups, wheelchairs and walkers, crutches, assistance items for adults and kids with disabilities, strollers for babies and toddlers, and pet food.

Dormition Ukrainian Catholic Parish - Engagement Coordinator

The Ukrainian Catholic Church of the Dormition of the Blessed Mother of God ("Dormition Parish") is a community of 400 souls, located in Saskatoon and affiliated with several rural parishes in small, nearby communities. Our mission is to seek to build a welcoming community of faith filled and searching individuals who explore, live, and celebrate and share the good news of Jesus Christ. One of the parish goals is to sustain the current growth of the community and support the volunteer base through the creation of an Engagement Coordinator position.

On a part time basis (up to 20hrs per week), the Engagement Coordinator will be responsible for assisting the parish in coordinating, managing, and expanding ministry activities. They will have attributes that allow them to be mission oriented, thrive in small team environments and importantly are self starters with strong organizational and administrative skills. The successful candidate is foremost someone who loves the Catholic faith and is eager to share that faith by developing positive relationships with a broad range of parishioners and members of the community. The position reports to the parish priest and is accountable to the Parish Executive.

Job Responsibilities

- Assists the parish priest and volunteers in coordinating and inspiring ministry activities.
- Supports the membership committee in the preparation and follow-up of the annual parish survey.
- Assists with parish communications, including publishing and distributing the weekly parish bulletin.
- Maintains parish database of parishioners, leaders, volunteers, and participants in ministries.
- Basic website administration and promotion of parish events.

Qualifications/attributes

- Discretion and confidentiality are mandatory.
- Outgoing and personable, with strong communication skills, and comfortable in a group setting.
- A team player with good organizational skills
- A flexible work schedule: work from home, parish office and some nights or weekends, as agreed to with the priest.
- Fully initiated Catholic in communion with the Catholic Church
- Computer proficiency, specifically Microsoft Office or Google Docs, and basic web page management.
- The successful candidate will be required to complete the Eparchy of Saskatoon Safeguarding Training and complete a criminal record check prior to commencing employment.

Salary/term

- The Salary will be commensurate with experience and consistent with similar positions in the Eparchy.
- This is a one-year term position. Renewal/extension subject to annual Parish Council review.
